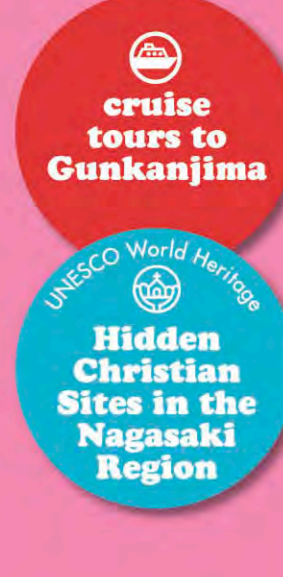

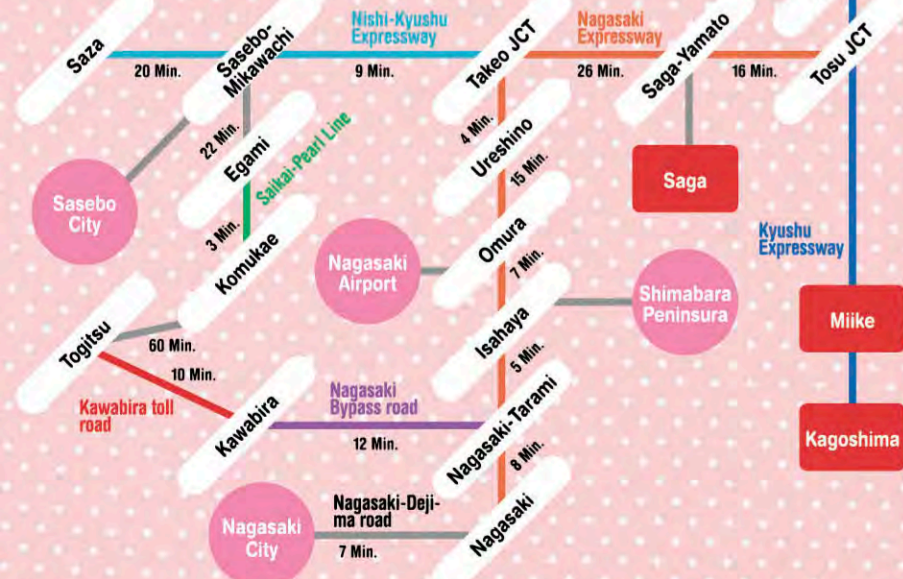

Minami Kushiyama Tanabatake Observation Deck D-5
 The deck overlooks about 800 terraced fields. On clear days, you can see Nagasaki City.

Hara Castle Ruins D-5
 The site of the Shimabara Rebellion 400 years ago and is registered as a World Heritage site.

Ayugae Falls D-5
 An old tale says that sweetfish used to return to the basin. The beautiful flow of water attracts many tourists.

Shimabara Castle D-4
 The castle tower was re-constructed in 1964, and the top floor offers a panoramic view of the Ariake Sea and Shimabara.

Shimabara samurai residences D-4
 Built on the edge of Shimabara Castle, Spring water from Kumano Shrine flows through the canal.

City of Swimming Carp D-4
 Nishikigoi swims in the beautiful spring water, making Shimabara, the "Water Capital of Japan."

MSDF Sasebo History Museum B-2
 Established as a facility devoted to the heritage of the Japanese Navy. It has exhibits on the birth of the modern navy, the Russo-Japanese War, and the Pacific War. It also introduces the MSDF.

250 Ton Crane at Sasebo Heavy Industries Co., Ltd. B-2
 The crane was completed in 1913. At 62 m tall and with a rotating boom length of 81 m, it had the world's largest lifting capacity at that time. The crane is still in operation.

Old Sasebo Wireless Transmission (Radio Transmitting Station) Facility B-3
 The station is an Important Cultural Property. The tower took 4 years to build starting in 1916, and is the oldest radio tower in Japan. The towers relayed the message for the attack on Pearl Harbor.

Nishi-Kyushu Shinkansen KAMOME
 Nishi-kyushu section between Nagasaki and Takeo Onsen on the Nishi Kyushu Shinkansen opened on September 23, 2022 and reduce travel time by 30 minutes.

Nagasaki Bio Park B-3
 Visitors can not only see but also directly interact with animals living in their natural habitat. You can also enjoy full facilities such as a tropical flower dome and various events.

Iojimazaki Lighthouse B-5
 The first iron hexagonal Western-style lighthouse in Japan built in 1866. The dome ceiling has been restored to its original shape despite being damaged by the atomic bomb.

Ono Village in Sotome B-5
 A village where Christians hid during the Edo period.

Shitsu Village in Sotome B-5
 A village where Christians hid during the Edo period.

Remains of the Shirogashima Island Battery B-5
 The ruins show how the 10th lord of the Saga Domain introduced Western military technology to Nagasaki.

International submarine cable Kogakura landing B-5
 The facility served as an important hub for external communications for almost a century since a long-distance submarine cable was laid between Nagasaki, Shanghai, and Vladivostok between 1871 to 1883.

Nagasaki City Takashima Coal Mine C-3
 The mine has numerous exhibits, including the world's largest Tyrannosaurus skeleton replica, measuring approximately 13 meters. It is the only one of its kind in the world.

Nagasaki Kameyama Shachu Memorial Museum C-5
 Opened in 2009, the museum stands on the site of Kameyama Shachu, Japan's first trading company. The museum exhibits materials related to the people associated with the company.

Shitsu Church B-4
 A small Christian community that went into hiding during the religious ban that continued their faith regardless of the risks involved.

Ono Village in Sotome B-4
 The villagers appeared to be worshippers of the shrine, but in fact, they were praying to their own religious objects they had enshrined.

Goto Islands

The Goto Islands are an archipelago of approximately 150 islands of various sizes in the western part of Nagasaki Prefecture. Almost the entire area is designated as Saikai National Park and has rich natural scenery, which attracts many tourists for its marine sports and fishing. The islands are also culturally valuable, with many Catholic churches scattered throughout, some of which have been registered as World Heritage sites in 2018. In this section, we introduce some of the must-see spots on the fascinating islands of Goto.

Take a Walk Through a Myriad of Incredible Pottery Art

Hasamiyaki Ware

Since the production of ceramics began at the end of the 16th century, Hasami is one of the leading centers of ceramic production along with Arita and Mikawachi. During the Edo period, "kurawanka bowls" were mass-produced here as everyday tableware, and porcelain, considered to be high-class, was popularized among the general public. Today, it is still popular for its diverse designs.

1 Ruins of the Nakao-Uwanobori kiln C-3
 The ruins of the kiln are located in the Nakaoyama and the kiln is said to have once been the 2nd largest in the world.

2 Hasami Ceramics Park C-3
 The park has an open-air museum. The Hasami Porcelain Festival is held during Golden Week and is a must-see.

3 Former Fukkoseitoshu workshop C-3
 The Fukukigishi family owned this pottery workshop and its remnants are displayed as the decoration.

Kujukushima Saikai National Parks

A scenic archipelago of 208 islands. "Kujukushima" means virtually uncountable, and the density of islands is the highest in Japan.

 A popular resort complex where you can enjoy an aquarium, restaurants, shops, sea-bathing, and cruises around Kujukushima.

Hidden Christian Sites in Nagasaki and Amakusa

A heritage site where Christians lived Japanese lifestyles while continuing their faith in secret during the religious ban. There are 12 components that describe the period of hiding.

Shitsu Village in Sotome B-4
 A small Christian community that went into hiding during the religious ban that continued their faith regardless of the risks involved.

Ono Village in Sotome B-4
 The villagers appeared to be worshippers of the shrine, but in fact, they were praying to their own religious objects they had enshrined.

Villages on Kuroshima Island A-3
 The church is on the island where Christians in hiding continued their faith in secret, while belonging to a Buddhist temple during the religious ban.

Ikeshima Coal Mine Tour

Ikeshima is the last coal mine in Kyushu and was operated until 2001. Many of the facilities still remain, and the tour of the coal mine, guided by former miners, is very popular.

1 Kashiragashima Church
 This church is designated as an Important Cultural Property in 2001. It is known for gorgeous interior decorated with floral patterns featuring camellias.

2 Wakamatsu Obashi Bridge
 The bridge connects Nakadori and Wakamatsu islands with a clear emerald sea. It is a truly a spectacular sight and a soothing spot for visitors.

3 Tambolo sandbar of Maeshima
 This sandbar appears only at low tide, and can be walked. The pale stretch of tambolo is truly a spectacular sight and a soothing spot for visitors.

4 Former Gorin Church
 The temple was saved in its original form by the efforts of the local worshippers and reflects the church architecture of the time.

5 Dozaki Church
 Dozaki is the first wooden church in Goto and was rebuilt in brick. Now it is open as a museum that exhibits the history of the Christian persecution.

6 Takahama Beach
 A beautiful beach with a clear emerald sea, white sand and views of Saganoshima in west. Takahama Beach is one of the 100 best beaches in Japan.

Urakami Cathedral B-1

The cathedral was built by Christians who withstood persecution and gained their freedom after the Meiji Restoration. The Angelus bell, which withstood the A-bomb, rings 3 times a day. 1-79 Motomachi, Nagasaki City. ACCESS 3 minutes by foot from Peace Park streetcar stop.

Dejima C-4

Travel back in time by a recreation of the streets of Dejima, the only trading port in Japan open to Europe for about 200 years during Japan's isolation. 6-1 Dejima-machi, Nagasaki City. ACCESS 5 minutes by foot from the Dejima streetcar stop.

Nagasaki Museum of History and Culture C-4

A unique museum that reconstructs the Nagasaki Magistrate's Tayemaya Office during. It has a full range of exhibits that all ages can enjoy and learn from. 1-1-1 Tayemaya, Nagasaki City. ACCESS 5 minutes by foot from Sakuramachi streetcar stop.

Shiseki Ryotei Kagetsu C-4

A 380-year-old ryotei that was visited at the end of the Edo period by patriots such as Katsushika and Sakamoto Ryoma. It is a historic site with many items related to the great men. 2-1 Maruyama-machi, Nagasaki City. ACCESS 2 minutes by foot from Shimbashi streetcar stop.

Nagasaki Atomic Bomb Memorial Hall for the Atomic Bomb Victims B-1

The exhibition tells the story of the atomic bombing of Nagasaki on August 9, 1945, the process leading up to the bombing, the history of nuclear weapons development, and the desire for peace. 7-8 Hirano-machi, Nagasaki City. ACCESS 5 minutes by foot from Atomic Bomb Museum streetcar stop.

SITES OF JAPAN'S MEIJI INDUSTRIAL REVOLUTION

IRON AND STEEL, SHIPBUILDING AND COAL MINING

Japan rapidly industrialized from the latter half of the 19th century to become an industrial nation. Of the 23 heritage sites throughout Japan about the industrialization of its heavy industries, 8 sites related to the shipbuilding and coal industries are in Nagasaki.

Thomas Blake Glover

During the upheaval at the end of the Edo period, Thomas Glover developed contacts with samurai clans and had a key role in overthrowing the shogunate. He remained in Japan and devoted himself to modernizing the country.

Iwasaki Yataro

Iwasaki Yataro founded the Tsukumo Trading Company which became Mitsubishi. He built great wealth by monopolizing the government's transportation of munitions, and diversifying into coal mining, shipbuilding, and banking.

Mitsubishi Limited Partnership, which laid the foundation of Japan's shipbuilding industry

Mitsubishi dates back to 1870, when Iwasaki Yataro established a shipping business with the goal of importing technology and developing its own made-in-Japan versions. By the late Meiji period, it had world-leading shipbuilding capacity.

Kosuge Slip Dock A

Equipped with a steam engine powered towing device. Planned by Thomas Glover to repair foreign ships, it was Japan's first Western shipyard. The repairation hut is the oldest existing brick building in Japan and is now a national historic site. 5 Kosuge-machi, Nagasaki City (Nagasaki City Call Center "Aisai Call"). ACCESS 15 minutes by car from Nagasaki Station.

Glover House and Office F

Thomas B. Glover's base of operations. Said to be the first building to blend Japanese and Western architecture, it was the base of Thomas Glover, who contributed to the modernization of Japan. 8-1 Minamiyamate-machi, Nagasaki City. ACCESS 8 minutes by foot from Oura Cathedral streetcar stop.

Takashima Coal Mine G

First introduction of steam engines to the coal industry in Japan. The first modern coal mine in Japan to use a steam engine. Hokkei Mine site is typical of the early days of modern coal mining technology. 5-1 Takashima-machi, Nagasaki City. ACCESS 25 minutes by foot from Takashimako Terminal.

Hashima Coal Mine H

One of the world's leading offshore coal mines. Surrounded by a giant seawall, the mine is also known as "Battleship Island" because of its resemblance to a battleship. Takashima-machi, Hashima Nagasaki City Call Center "Aisai Call". ACCESS 40 minutes by boat from Gunkanjima cruises.

Mitsubishi Senshokaku Guest House C

Venerable guest house overlooking Nagasaki Port. The building was constructed in 1904. When Prince Higashifushimi Yorihito stayed here, it was named "Senshokaku" (a scenic spot). It is used as a venue for shipbuilding events.

Mitsubishi No.3 Dry Dock D

The largest dry dock in the Orient at that time. No. 3 Dry Dock was built in 1905 by digging the cliff behind and reclaiming the sea in front of it. The drainage pumps are still in operation, preserving its original state.

Mitsubishi Giant Cantilever Crane E

The world's oldest electric crane of the same type. An electric crane with a lift capacity of 150 tons built with the electrification of shipyard equipment. It is still used today to load steam turbines and other equipment.

10 million dollars night view: Nagasaki

Nagasaki has one of the world's 3 best new nightscapes. The bowl-like terrain of mountains surrounding the city creates a panoramic nightscape where visitors can enjoy the view from various points.

Inasayama observation platform A-3

On a clear day, you can see as far as the Goto Islands, Unzen and Amakusa from the observation tower. You can reach the top of Mt. Inasa by ropeway with an exceptional view from the glass gondola. 364 Inasaya-machi, Nagasaki City.

Kazagashira Park C-5

This park is famous for kite flying and the statue of Sakamoto Ryoma. It is also known for its cherry blossoms in spring and hydrangeas in early summer. Enjoy the lights with the city in front of you. 3-510-6 Irabayashi, Kazagashira-machi, Nagasaki City.

Nabekannuriyama observation platform B-5

The observation platform affords a panoramic view of Nagasaki Port from Mt. Nabekannuri. You can take pictures of the beautiful scenery as cruise ships enter the port passing under the Megami Bridge. 2-14-1 Izumo, Nagasaki City.
